

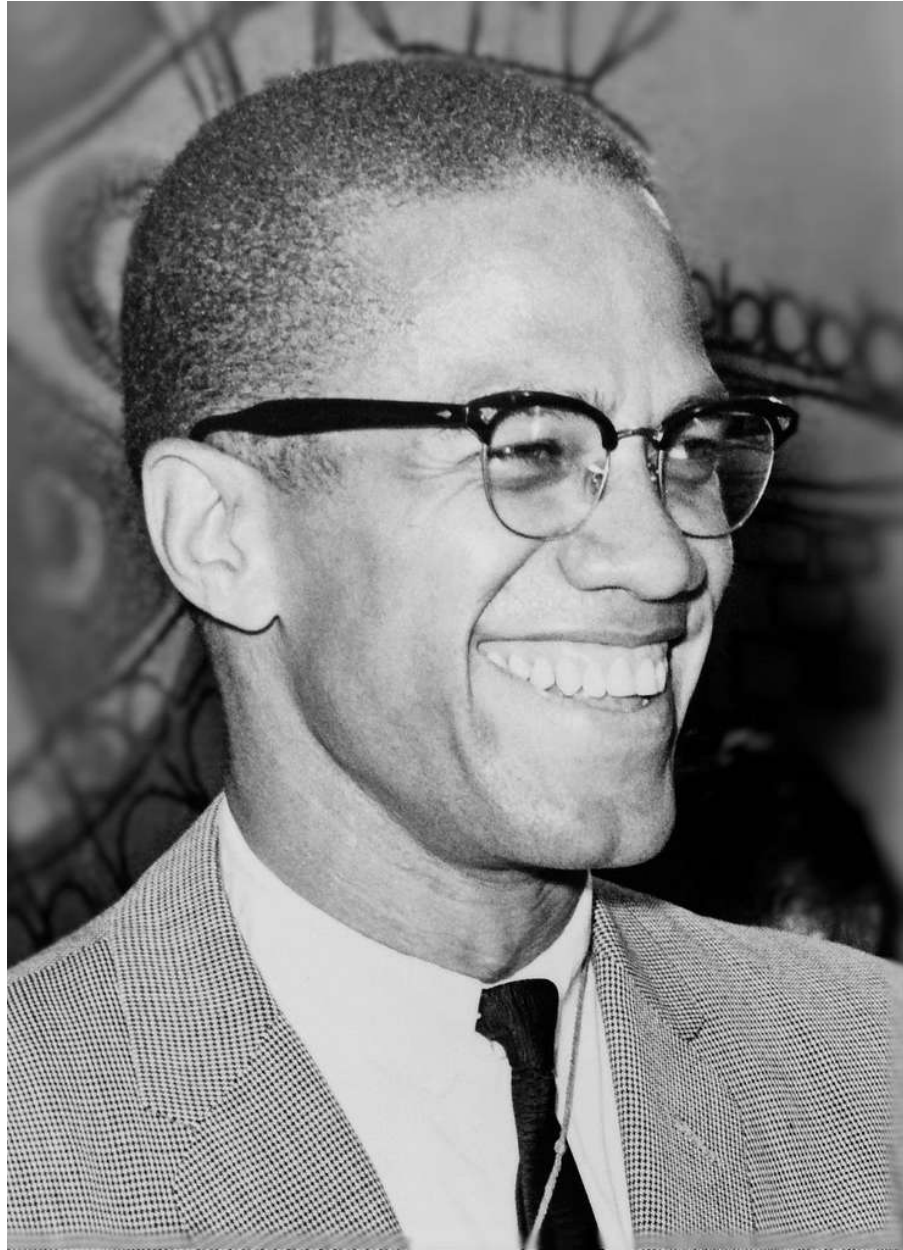
Martin Luther King Jr.

- Even though it was hard, she was brave and stood up for what was right.



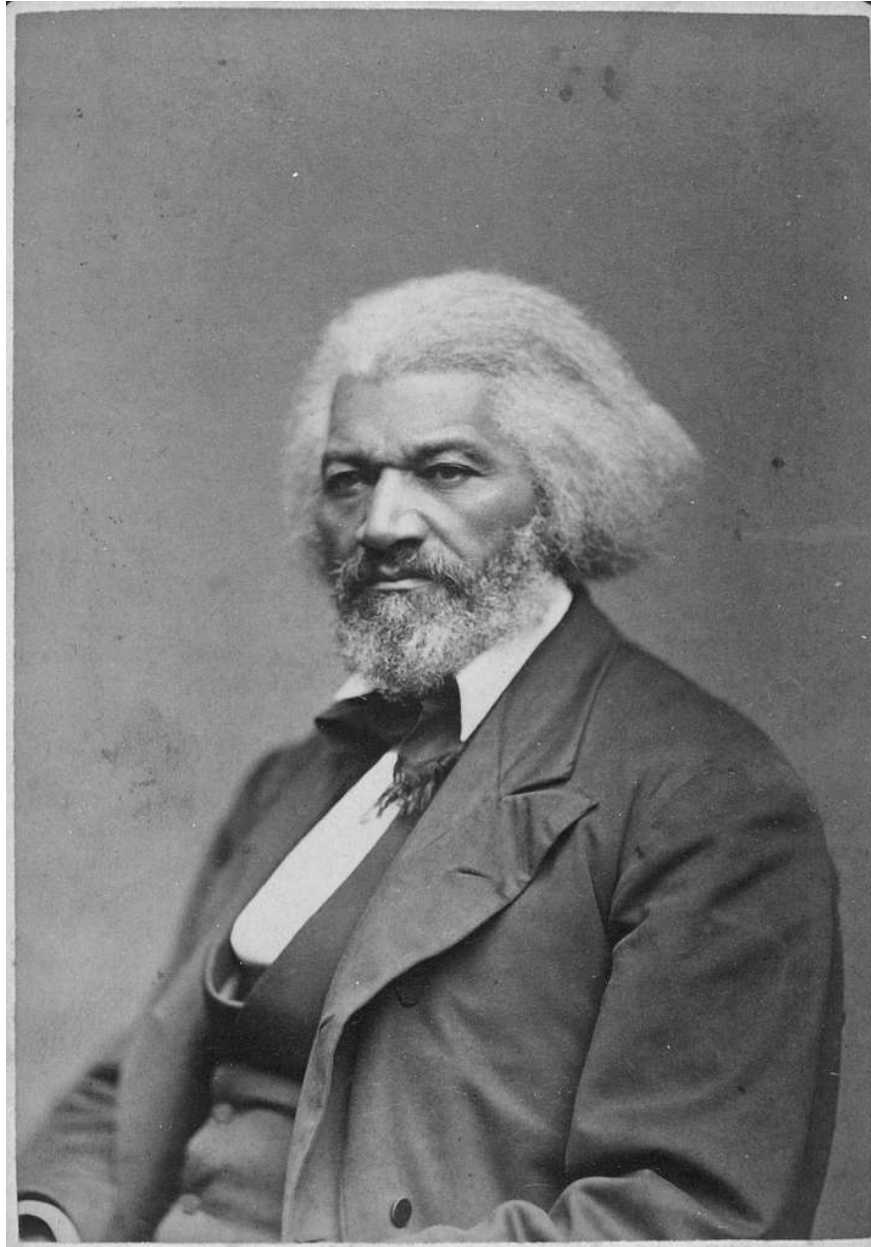
Malcolm X
